## Re: Abandoned Vehicles on Alaska Highway

Thank you for your email of January 27, 2021, regarding abandoned vehicles on the Alaska Highway. The December incident was tragic, and my thoughts are with the family of the motorist.

Safety is the ministry's highest priority, and that includes keeping B.C.'s highways unobstructed. If an abandoned vehicle is in any part of a lane or obstructing snow removal operations, it will be towed immediately. In this case, we have not confirmed if the vehicle was abandoned or if it experienced a mechanical breakdown. I am advised it was parked along the highway shoulder for less than 12 hours prior to the incident.

The ministry aims to strike a balance between clearing abandoned vehicles and towing parked cars. You can read an <u>overview of the removal process on our TranBC website</u>.

I recognize you would like the ministry to revisit our legislation and reduce the time frame allotted for the removal of abandoned vehicles on highways from the existing 72 hours. You may be interested to know that, in 2004, the Highway Scenic Improvement Act was repealed, and its contents were <u>incorporated into the Transportation Act and regulations</u>. The ministry regularly reviews its policies to ensure they remain current and appropriate, and I have shared your request with the staff of our Transportation Policy and Legislation branch.
