Subject: Service Establishment – Hockey Canada

OPTIONS: [Corporate Unweighted]

- 1. That the Regional Board approve the establishment of a service function for Hockey Canada; further, that a regional Hockey Canada Service establishment bylaw be drafted for consideration by the Regional Board as the next step in the service establishment process.
- 2. That the Regional Board refuse the establishment of a service function for Hockey Canada.

BACKGROUND/RATIONALE:

At the February 17, 2021 Special Board meeting, the Regional Board passed the following resolutions:

MOVED, SECONDED and CARRIED

That the Regional Board consider the establishment of a service function to support PRRD funded hockey events in the region.

MOVED, SECONDED and CARRIED

That the Regional Board receive a report on funding models for the proposed museum, geopark, and hockey event service functions.

The most recent & anticipated future hockey events are as follows:

- 2015 WU17 Hockey Challenge
- 2017 WU17 Hockey Challenge
- 2019 World Junior A Challenge
- 2021 National Women's U18 National Championship
- 2022 World Sledge Hockey Challenge

The City of Dawson Creek has signed a five year Hosting Agreement with Hockey Canada from January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2023 with hopes of a renewal. Hockey events have, no doubt, had a positive financial impact on the region and the Economic Impact Assessments from both the 2015 and 2017 WU17 Hockey Challenge events are attached for information.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS:

- 1. That the Regional Board consider including funding for Hockey Canada in Function 140 Economic Development once a strategy has been determined.
- 2. That the Regional Board provide further direction.

STRATEGIC PLAN RELEVANCE:

Not Applicable to Strategic Plan.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION(S):

The PRRD has provided a total of \$389,500 in grant contributions to support the Hockey Canada events held in the region. A total of \$209,500 was paid from Function 140, Economic Development, \$135,000 from Function 275, Grants to Community Organizations and \$45,000 was paid from Function 130, Administrative Fiscal and Other. All funds were issued to the City of Dawson Creek for the purposes of hosting Hockey Canada events as outlined below.

The PRRD also approved a multi-year commitment of \$150,000 to be issued as an annual grant in the amount of \$50,000 from 2014 to 2016 for the City of Dawson Creek to prepare for and host the International Ice Hockey Federation 2016 U18 Women's World Championships. However, the City was not selected to host this event and no grant funding was ever paid out.

Based on 2021's Completed Assessment roll, if this service function was a regional function and the maximum requisition was \$200,000 based on Land & Improvements, the tax rate would be approximately \$0.0062 / \$1,000.

If the same requisition amount was applied (\$200,000) to Improvements only, the tax rate would be \$0.0077 / \$1,000.

COMMUNICATIONS CONSIDERATION(S):

OTHER CONSIDERATION(S):

Dawson Creek received a grant in the amount of \$100,000 for Hockey Canada in 2020 through Economic Development – Function 140, however the event did not take place and the money was returned and has been budgeted under Economic Development for 2021.
