Story of the Northern Co-Hort

- PRRD hired Consulting firm Eco Tactix to conduct research and publish the North Peace Horticulture Business Case and Marketing Strategy in 2018
- Founded in Fall of 2018 with intent to increase food

Northern Co-Hort Culture

• We have an opportunity to do business differently as a collective

• We are trying to change our food system by decentralizing it and making regional food accessible to Peace Region residents, though direct sales and eventually to restaurants, grocery stores, and institutions.

• Many producers in our collective have a focus on soil health,

regenerative agriculture and permaculture principles.

- These principals can be applied in many ways:
 - O Initiatives of fair share, reciprocity, access, security and empathy.

O Supporting other members in the NCH can take many forms, including: volunteering, attending events, tool and machinery sharing, mentoring members to teach unique skills, advertising for the NHC and fellow producer members at markets, and participating in group wholesale purchases, among many others.

Research and Development



• 2021/2022 Research project in partnership with Fixed Earth Innovations, Aaron Mackay and Blackbird Environmental.

• Research taking place at Beatton Hills Orchard, Hasberry Farm, Running Acres Farm and Treehouse Haskap.

• Testing local plant beneficial microbes to improve soil health in haskap and sour cherry orchards, potentially reducing the need for synthetic fertilizer.

• Project funded by the Canadian Agricultural Partnership and the Investment Agriculture Foundation of BC.

Research and Development

Soil Health Matters Program 2021

- Soil health research project in collaboration with four cross-commodity producers in Rose Prairie funded by the Vancouver Foundation Systems Change development grant
- Research team: Julie Robinson, Sandra Burton, and Matthias Loeseken, with support from Bess Legault and Keira Nichol at the Northern Co-Hort.
- One-on-one sessions with soil health experts to discuss producer concerns related to soil health, conduct soil sampling and on-site testing.
- Identify the present role of soil health and the potential for systems change to support soil health-focussed production.
- Field tour to provide an opportunity for knowledge transfer between producers and enrich the understanding of soil health as it applies to the farm as an ecosystem.

Collaborative Partnership with ACL Community Farm

Partnership with Fort St. John Association for Community Living
Currently developing a permaculturebased therapeutic farm for ACL clients to connect to the land and systems
Two farm plots are being developed for programming with plans to build a greenhouse and animal shelter for sheep

Doig River First Nations Food Security Planning

• Began supporting food security programming in 2020

• Supported by the Eco Farm Skill program labour access

• 1 acre in ground garden was developed and planted in June of 2020

• A beautiful raised bed gathering area was also developed

• Safely gathered outdoors with elders and children to paint vegetables and fruits on river rocks and learned Beaver language as stories were shared about harvesting wild strawberries



Urban Edibles (Urban Garden Support)

- Proposed extension of the Eco Farm Skills student program offered to urban growers
- Student support during slower seasons for urban growers, gardens and food forests of all sizes
- This program will be rolled out as an additional offering to the community, pending student availability during the season
- 4 participating homes last year
- Precedence for access to students will be given to Co-Hort members
- Less likely to be running this summer, but it is an option if members want a lower rate
