The Board wishes to express its extreme disappointment that the engagement process for the 'Winter Motorized Recreation Management Plan in the South Peace' was largely disregarded and ignored when the plan was drafted, reminiscent of the previous public engagement done regarding the Partnership Agreement for the Conservation of the Southern Mountain Caribou when the Province largely ignored the thoughtful responses, suggestions, and recommendations provided by residents and liaison Blair Lekstrom.

Thoughtful consideration of input from groups such as the South Peace Snowmobile Advisory Committee is required to understand local impacts, and transparently deliver any decisions made to protect caribou populations, with the least impact on resident lifestyles. The Board and member municipalities have encouraged members of the public to visit the Provincial Caribou Recovery Engagement website to review and provide input on the 'Winter Motorized Recreation Management Plan in the South Peace.'
