That the Broadband Internet and Mobility Committee identify service providers operating in the region that the Committee would like to invite to a future Committee meeting to communicate service needs, to learn about the service providers' connectivity plans for the region.

# **BACKGROUND/RATIONALE:**

The role of the Standing Committee, as outlined in the Terms of Reference approved by the Regional Board, to set out the Committee's tasks on behalf of the Board, includes engagement with service providers and stakeholders, research and review of current technologies and market trends, examining funding opportunities, developing a connectivity work plan, and making recommendations to the PRRD Board regarding Broadband Internet and mobility policy(ies) that will fulfill the PRRD's connectivity vision.

To ensure that the Connectivity Strategic Plan is comprehensive, scalable, inclusive, and meets the needs of the community, local governments should engage with local ISPs, First Nations, funding partners, technical experts, government agencies, business and residents to understand the challenges and priorities of the community, identify goals, and addresses needs or gaps in service. Stakeholders, First Nations, local governments, internet and mobility service providers, and other parties that are identified by the Committee will be invited to meet with the Committee at a future meeting, or submit a written response to the Committee identifying their connectivity needs, challenges, and priorities.
