



## Who is MARR?

- The Major Appliance Recycling Roundtable (MARR) is a not-forprofit stewardship agency created to implement and operate the stewardship plan for end-of-life major household appliances in the province of British Columbia (BC)
- MARR operates on behalf of the major appliance producers who are obligated under the BC Recycling Regulation.
- The stewardship plan was developed jointly by the Association of Home Appliance Manufacturers Canada (AHAM Canada) and Retail Council of Canada (RCC) in response to the requirements of the BC Recycling Regulation.





## What does MARR do?

- The MARR plan is focused on enhancing the performance and transparency of the existing market-based system
- The plan is designed to achieve the aims of the **BC Recycling Regulation** within the context of a market-driven system. MARR's focus is on:
  - Implementing a recycling and processing standard
  - Establish no fee drop off for the public by paying the cost for collection
  - Setup collection/diversion tracking and reporting systems to assess system performance over time
  - Create an education and communications program
  - Report annually to the BC Ministry of Environment on MARR's progress achieving the commitments outlined above






## Becoming a Collector

- Fee Payment Structure
  - 1. Admin/Reporting fee
  - 2. ODS handling reimbursement
  - 3. Scrap Metal revenue
  - 4. Transportation subsidy
- Requirements
  - No fee to public for drop off
  - Accept all products covered by the program
  - Counting and reporting
