Territorial Acknowledgment





Our Role

We oversee activities from exploration and development, to pipeline transportation and reclamation. Our role includes refineries, value added gas and liquids manufacturing processes, aspects of geothermal power, and recently expanded to include carbon capture, hydrogen, ammonia and methanol.

Funding & Accountability

The BCER is funded through the application of fees and levies. We are accountable to the provincial legislature and the public through the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation.

Community Well-Being




Accountability for social well-being mandated through our legislation and operationalized through the Strategic Framework.
