#### 6.1 BC Energy Regulator (BCER) - Overview of the BC Oil and Gas Commission (10:00 am)

Michelle Carr, Commissioner and CEO of the BC Energy Regulator, Sara Dickinson, Executive Lead - Reconciliation and Engagement and Garth Thoroughgood, VP, of Indigenous Relations and Community Engagement, were in attendance to provide an overview of the BC Oil and Gas Commission.

BC Oil and Gas Commission (BCOGC) is a Crown corporation responsible for regulating oil and gas activities in BC, including exploration, development, pipeline transportation and reclamation. The BCOGC underwent a name change to BC Energy Regulator (BCER) as part of recent legislation. The role of the BCER – is to regulate the full life cycle of energy resource activities in BC, from site planning to restoration. Their role includes refineries, value added gas and liquids manufacturing processes, aspects of geothermal power, and recently expanded to include carbon capture, hydrogen, ammonia and methanol.



### 6.1. BC Energy Regulator (BCER) - Overview of the BC Oil and Gas Commission (cont'd)

The BCER is funded through the application of fees and levies. Accountable to the provincial legislature and the public through the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation. Topics and discussion items included:
