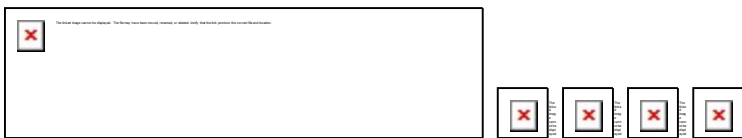
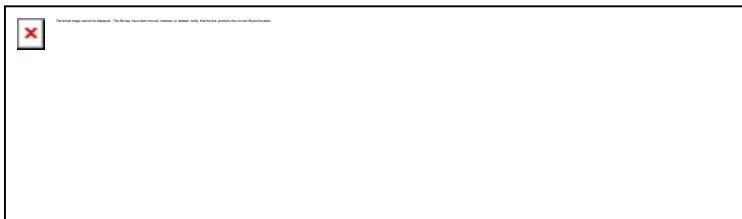

The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (Ministry) has received and reviewed your referral for the Temporary Use Permit (20-003-TUP) to allow outdoor parking, outdoor storage of logs, outdoor storage of pipe for the oil and gas industry, placement of one 12 ft x 40 ft office trailer, and placement of one weigh scale within DISTRICT LOT 1664, PEACE RIVER DISTRICT. The Ministry has reviewed the proposal and has no objections at this time.

The Ministry is in support of the proposal; however, it should be noted that the existing access connecting the Forest Service Road to the Alaska Highway (Rte 97- NB) requires a permit. Under Section 49 of the Transportation Act the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure can restrict access to or from a controlled access highway. The applicant is to apply online for an 'Access to a Controlled access Highway' permit prior to the commencement of the project.
