#### 1. Purpose

1.1 The purpose of the Flag <u>Half-Masting</u> Policy is to establish guidelines as to when flags flown at the Peace River Regional District (PRRD) Head Office are to be respectfully lowered to half-mast.

#### 2. Scope

2.1 This Statement of Policy applies to flags being half-masted at the PRRD Head Office.

# 3. Definitions

- 3.1 *Half-Masting:* refers to a flag flown at half-mast as a sign of mourning and respect. The flag is brought to the half-mast position by raising it to the top of the mast and immediately lowering it slowly to half-mast.
- 3.2 *Funeral*: refers to the observances held for someone who's passed, usually before the burial or cremation. The person's body is present at a funeral.
- 3.3 *Memorial Service:* refers to a commemorative service held for someone who's passed. The person's body is not present at a memorial service. If a burial occurs prior to the service, the service is then considered a memorial service.

## 4. Policy

- 4.1 The Canadian flag is to be in the position of honour, followed by the provincial flag, and then the local government flag.
  - a) When three flags are displayed, the position of honour is in the center. The secondranking flag is placed to the left of center, and the other to the right.

## 4.2 Half-Masting

a) When <u>half-masting</u> one flag, all flags being flown must be half-masted.

- b) Half-masting is to occur from the time of notification of death until sunset on the day of the <u>funeral</u>, or from the time of notification of death until sunset the following day and from sunrise to sunset on the day of the <u>memorial service</u>, on these following occasions:
  - If the notification of death lands outside of typical business hours, the flag will be half-masted on the nearest business day after notification. The same practices will be used in re-raising the flag when the <u>funeral</u> or <u>memorial</u> <u>service</u> occurs outside typical business hours.
  - ii. On the death of a Sovereign member or a member of the Royal Family related in the first degree to the Sovereign.
  - iii. On the death of the Governor General, the Prime Minister, a former Governor General, a former Prime Minister, or a federal Cabinet Minister.
  - iv. On the death of the Lieutenant Governor or the Premier.
  - v. On the death of a Member of the House of Commons or a Member of the Legislative Assembly when that member represents the PRRD.
  - vi. When the PRRD is notified or becomes aware via the news, or word of mouth, etc.:
    - on the death of a current Director or Alternate Director of the Regional Board;
    - on the death of a current First Nations Leader within the PRRD boundaries; and/or
    - on the death of a current PRRD staff member.
  - vii. Upon notification, the PRRD will verify the death and the type of service that will be held for the deceased and thus will half-mast the flag in accordance with the service.
  - viii. In the event of a death not specified in this policy, the PRRD will follow the direction of the Federal Department of Canadian Heritage.
- c) <u>Half-masting</u> is to occur from sunrise to sunset on the day of the following occasions, unless the occasion occurs outside of normal business hours, in which case the flags are to be half-masted on the prior adjacent business day and raised on the next appropriate business day.
  - i. On the Day of Mourning for persons killed or injured in the workplace (April 28<sup>th</sup>).
  - ii. On the National Day of Remembrance for Victims of Terrorism (June 23<sup>rd</sup>).

- iii. On the second Sunday in September, which is the Firefighters' National Memorial Day.
- iv. On the last Sunday in September, which is the Police and Peace Officers' National Memorial Day.
- v. On the National Day of Remembrance and Action for Missing Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (October 4<sup>th</sup>).
- vi. On Remembrance Day (November 11<sup>th</sup>).
- vii. On the National Day of Remembrance and Action On Violence Against Women (December 6<sup>th</sup>).
- d) On the death of a person(s), or an event, the Chief Administrative Officer, in consultation with the Chair or Vice Chair, shall have the authority to bestow this honour on behalf of the PRRD.
