**Proposed Addition to Reserve - West Moberly First Nations** Re: Treaty 8 Land Entitlement Additional Lands – Moberly Lake North Shore & **Moberly Lake South Shore Land Selections** 

West Moberly First Nations ("West Moberly"), the Province of BC and Canada finalized the settlement of treaty land entitlement on February 3, 2023. The settlement resolves the Treaty 8 land entitlement claims of West Moberly.

Under the terms of the settlement, it is contemplated that West Moberly may apply to add provincial Crown land as reserve in accordance with, and subject to, fulfilment of the requirements of Canada's Additions to Reserves/Reserve Creation policy. These requirements include notification to local government. I acknowledge that by a letter dated January 13, 2020, the Peace River Regional District indicated that it supported, in principle, West Moberly in their negotiations regarding the settlement of the Treaty 8 Land Entitlement.

I am writing to inform you that West Moberly has, by way of a Band Council Resolution, submitted a request to Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) for an Addition to Reserve. West Moberly has requested that certain lands at Moberly Lake, located in the Peace River Regional District, be set apart as reserve (the "Proposed Addition to Reserve") under the settlement.

The lands for the Proposed Addition to Reserve for Moberly Lake North Shore are unsurveyed provincial Crown lands which are in the process of being surveyed. The lands are currently identified as Moberly Lake North Shore as shown on the attached map entitled "West Moberly First Nations Overlap Consultation Moberly Lake North and South Shore Parcels".



The lands for the Proposed Addition to Reserve for Moberly Lake South Shore are surveyed provincial Crown lands currently described as:

## In the Province of British Columbia In Peace River District

All of Block A of District Lot 4526, as shown on Plan EPC2385 filed in the Crown Land Registry; a copy of said plan is recorded as Plan 112839 in the Canada Lands Surveys Records.

Lands described comprise about **198** hectares (489 acres).

(The "Proposed Reserve Land")

The Moberly Lake South Shore parcel is also shown on the attached map. Both the Moberly Lake North Shore and Moberly Lake South Shore would be an addition to West Moberly Lake 168A.

Local Governments and First Nation governments are encouraged to work together on common and shared obligations and goals. By working together, we can advance our collective work in the spirit of reconciliation and a nation-to-nation relationship.

I am pleased to know that the Peace River Regional District values its long-standing relationship with West Moberly. Canada, BC and West Moberly are working to complete this first addition to reserve proposal in the coming months Should you have any questions or wish to receive further information, I would request that you reply prior to June 6, 2024. 
