

Thank you for forwarding a draft copy of Peace River Regional District (PRRD) Temporary Use Permit 20-005 (the "TUP") for review and comment by the Agricultural Land Commission (ALC). The following comments are provided to help ensure that the TUP is consistent with the purposes of the *ALC Act* (ALC Act), the Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR) General Regulation, (the "ALR General Regulation"), the ALR Use Regulation (the "ALR Use Regulation"), and any decisions of the ALC.

The TUP proposes to establish a closed, dry, 144-person worker camp, including a seven-unit kitchen/dining/office complex on a 2.4 ha portion of the property identified as PID: 012-686-263 (the "Property") for three years. The area on the Property has previously been used for a temporary worker camp.

The Property is partially within the ALR, but the TUP is located on the portion of the Property outside of the ALR, as shown below.
