



Canadian Natural BC Operations



- Canadian Natural is one of the largest natural gas producers in BC – and the largest in Canada
- 605,000 mcf/d of Gas Production 13,300 bbl/d of Natural Gas Liquids
- Employment
 - Direct Employment: 290 employees
 - Direct, indirect and induced: 2,979 FTEs
- \$473 million Economic Contribution in 2019
 - 2019 Capital Investment: \$321 million
 - 2019 Operating Cost Investment: \$152 million
- \$17 million in property taxes in 2019


CARS OFF THE ROAD ANNUALLY*

Working Together with Local Communities


- Canadian Natural is proud to invest where we live and work

Dormant Well Management



- As part of our Dormant Site Reclamation Program (DSRP), Canadian Natural will be undertaking the following work in 2021:
- 913 sites in BLUE are identified for closure work within our 2021 annual work plan within the PRRD
- An additional 1037 sites in ORANGE received funding within the (DSRP) for future closure activity
- This represents upward of \$60 million of abandonment and reclamation activities in 2021 in PRRD



2020-2021 Drilling Activity Forecast



- 2020-2021 targeting to drill 40 wells in **PRRD**
 - 19 wells in Daiber
 - 12 wells in Blair
 - 2 wells Kobes
 - 5 wells in Septimus
 - 2 net non-op wells in Townsend
