6. ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION

6.1 SAR Group Updates

North Peace Search and Rescue Society:

- 2025 is off to a busy start, already on task number 12.
- The Society is focusing on completing lots of training this year.
- The group has now moved into a new location, working along with the City of Fort St John.
 There will be a grand opening in October, and an invitation will be extended to all the PRRD Directors and SAR teams.
- Working on reviewing/renewing EMCR GSAR gap analysis.
- Over the winter, received a CDFL kit, and has since applied to EMCR for the capability, hoping to be ready by the end of the 3rd quarter.
- Continued community support and fundraising.
- The Society has completed Adventure Smart presentations for 8 different schools.
- Currently, the Society has received 12 applications (GSAR), and of those 12, 10 have graduated and are able participate on the team. The team's total of volunteers is now at 43.
 Brian mentioned that there will be a new recruit group this winter, and they will include some current members in the program that are needing a refresher.

Tumber Ridge Search and Rescue Society:

- So far, the team has had 1 call this year.
- The Society will be taking a break in summer from weekly training, especially for those with families, until school starts.

- The Society is looking to complete more advanced training. There is a lot of interest in expanding teams and getting more designated advanced teams.
- Currently. The Society has 6 recruits, and 4 have passed. The total number of volunteers is now 23.
- The Society is working on updating and advancing first aid and certificates.
- The first week in July, the group is completing high-angle rope assessment, which will bring numbers up.

South Peace Emergency Response Team:

- So far, the call volume has been about the same from 2024, which was 5 tasks.
- Currently, the group has 5 new members who have completed the GSAR program. The Society is always accepting new recruits. 30 total active members
- Completed large in-depth first aid training (12 team members) for wilderness first responder.
- Currently working on flat water boat operators training (purchased boat, on its way).
- The Team has been participating in lots of fundraising, and upcoming is a golf tournament (next weekend).
- The group has an operational and administrative team with specific members now and noted that it has been a big help getting the word out and helped with the great engagement.
