# Project overview

- Coastal GasLink is a fully permitted pipeline to deliver natural gas to LNG Canada's facility.
- 670-kilometres in length, spanning from northeastern B.C. to Kitimat
- Approved initial capacity of 2.1 billion cubic feet per day, with potential future capacity of 5 billion cubic feet per day.



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- Approximately 123 kms ROW cleared **87%**
- Approximately 70 kms of pipe installed **50%**

## Socio-economic Effects Management Plan (SEEMP)

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1. Engage relevant organizations  
2x / year during construction to monitor effects and mitigation
2. Collect and analyze data
  - a) Qualitative (SEEMP contact feedback and engagement records)
  - b) Quantitative (information gathering from internal reports)
3. Report 2x / year during construction and 1 year post-construction
